Main Purpose

- 1. To supervise and coordinate a group of children (aged 7-13) in activities, such as sport, swimming, games, arts and craft, bushcraft, assault course, golf, and much more.
- 2. If residential, additional duties such as boarding supervision will be required.
- 3. All staff must have an overriding responsibility for the student's welfare and safety at all times during the course including times outside the normal duty rota.

- 3. To maintain student safety as a top priority and follow the School guidelines on Health and Safety contained in the Staff Handbook.

- 5. To take on the role and responsibilities of a night duty warden as described in the Staff Handbook.
- 6. To carry out a number of overnight duties throughout the course.
