BACKGROUND

Orwell Park School occupies a historic country house with linked teaching areas, boarding accommodation and sports facilities set in one hundred and ten acres of playing fields and woodlands overlooking the Orwell Estuary in Suffolk

The school has a reputation for academic excellence and for outstanding music, games and pastoral care. In the latest ISI Inspection, 2014, inspectors found:

Boarding is extremely popular at Orwell Park. Boys and girls board on a full, weekly and flexi basis. Although the majority of children board on a flexi basis, the ethos of the school is enhanced by its full boarders, a number of them from overseas, and those who board on a weekly basis.

Exceptional art, music, drama and CDT, amongst others, allow children to develop their skills and confidence in a truly cultured environment.
